FROM THE INTERIM MODERATOR

Dear Friends of Peterculter Parish Church

I hope you don't mind me sharing a recent experience which has very much been on my mind. Indeed, so much so, that some of my own congregation at Holburn West have been wondering when I am going to return to planet Earth. No, I haven't been up in a rocket, but I certainly felt I had ascended a mountain and had been greeted by a



magnificent view. Let me explain what I am so excited to report. On the 12th of May, following the invitation of the Aberdeen City Council, I accompanied the Lord Provost of Aberdeen to Pittodrie stadium for the conferral of the Freedom of the City to the Gothenburg Greats, marking the fortieth anniversary of the Aberdeen football team winning the European Cup Winners Cup after defeating Real Madrid. I had the privilege of being on the same stage as these legends.

I was impressed with many of the good qualities I observed in them. A wonderful sense of camaraderie that continues to exist between the players, which is rekindled when they meet up. They were clearly enjoying the fortieth anniversary celebrations. A tremendous sense of fun, laughter, and banter. And of course, a healthy pride in their amazing achievements as a team. Willie Miller, even forty years on, still carries with him a sense of authority, leadership, and presence which the players respect. Other players such as Neil Simpson, Peter Weir and Eric Black had a kind, respectful, encouraging way about them. Each player had a vital part to play in that successful team.

The team had a mix of youth and experience, of players hailing from the East coast and the West coast. They had strong leaders and strategists in the manager Sir Alex Ferguson and the coaching staff.

Although there are many stories of the strict and demanding training the players went through, that needs to be balanced by the stories of camaraderie, companionship, laughter, and care expressed. In the recent excellent BBC Scotland documentary "Aberdeen '83: Once in a Lifetime" Gordon Strachan reveals that at one point he may have considered walking away from football if it hadn't been for the friendship and support of that particular team. Scottish football would have been deprived of a tremendously talented footballer if that had happened. It was also very moving to observe how greatly the team still have a deep sense of grief and loss over the death of Neale Cooper, who contributed so much to the team off and on the pitch.

PRESBYTERY MATTERS

Unions and Church Name Changes.

At the Presbytery meeting on 25th April the Basis of Union agreed between Holburn West, Midstocket, Queen's Cross and Rubislaw was approved. The name of the united congregation is Fountainhall Church of Scotland. Two places of worship will be Queen's Cross, to be known as Fountainhall Church at the Cross (to which the Rev Duncan Eddie will be inducted) and Midstocket, to be known as Fountainhall at the Stocket. Holburn West and Rubislaw buildings are to be sold, let or otherwise disposed of.

Also approved was the Basis of Union agreed between Ferryhill, South Holburn and St Mark's. The name of the united congregation is Devana Parish Church of Scotland. Ferryhill will become Devana (Fonthill Road) and South Holburn, Devana (Holburn Street) with St Mark's to be used, sold, let or otherwise disposed of.

The intention is that a Parish Grouping, known in the Presbytery Plan as West End/City Centre/Riverside Area, be formed between the new congregations of Fountainhall and Devana.



Another approval was for the Basis of Union agreed between Skene and Kingswells. Kingshill Parish Church is the name of the united congregation with the building at Kingswells to be used, sold, let or otherwise disposed of.

The next Presbytery meeting is all day at Fountainhall Church at the Cross on Saturday the 17th of June.
