
FROM THE SESSION CLERK

I was delighted to see the congregational vote on 24th September gave unanimous support for the Basis of Union with Drumoak-Durris Church. Their congregation also voted overwhelmingly in favour of the Union.

After Presbytery confirm their endorsement, we should be able to establish the Union on 1st November. The tentative plan is for the customary worship programmes in both churches to remain in place until the new year to avoid the extra work that would be required to organise a combined Remembrance Day procedure and series of festive period services.

We do however plan to share morning worship with the congregation of Drumoak-Durris in Culter Kirk on 29th October when we will celebrate the Sacrament of Communion. We are grateful to the Rev. Corné Randall who will continue to provide full support to Culter Kirk and the current Culter parish over this period. Drumoak-Durris Church has alternative pulpit supply and pastoral support arranged until the end of the year.

At the meeting on Saturday, 2nd September Presbytery approved the Mission Plan of the former Presbytery of Moray which, since the start of the year, has been part of the new Presbytery of the NE and the Northern Isles. Covering between Aberdeen and Buckie, discussion about Moray served as a reminder of the vast area covered by the new Presbytery. In the Buckie part of the Moray Plan six buildings are to be retained and five to close, one being Cullen Auld Kirk. A representative from this church asked that this building be retained and the plan rejected. It is a category A listed building dating back to the 13th century with a long and complex history and is open bi-weekly for visitors. A strategic study in 2016 gave an estimated cost of £300,000 for necessary work.

An asset of the Auld Kirk is Cullen Hall Church. It is the focal point not only of social and fundraising activities of the church, but also of the entire community. This building has been chosen for the future work of the church in Cullen.

The Auld Kirk is to be sold, let or otherwise disposed of and is another example of many throughout the country of difficult decisions being made regarding historic church buildings.

The guest speaker at the meeting was Katie MacLean, Refugee Resettlement Manager, Aberdeenshire Council. Katie has worked over a number of years with the resettlement of refugees in Aberdeenshire, including Syrian New Scots and Ukrainian families. A common theme with the refugees is looking to the future and not dwelling on the past. Perhaps there are some lessons for us here in the Church of Scotland.

Katie is currently working with asylum seekers and is receiving some help from churches in the shire.
