Aberdeen West Parish Grouping

A decision taken at the Presbytery meeting on the 7th of November 2023 affecting our grouping is that approval was given to the Basis of Union between Craigiebuckler Parish Church and Ruthrieston West Parish Church with a date of union proposed to be the 1st of December 2023.

The name of the united charge will be Aberdeen Springfield Church of Scotland. Ruthrieston West building is to be sold, let or otherwise disposed of. A Team Ministry is to be formed between the Rev Kenneth Petrie and the Rev Benjamin Byun until the retiral of the Rev Kenneth Petrie in 2024. After his retirement, the Kirk Session could decide to create a locally funded post as part of a new

Also concerning Aberdeen West Parish Grouping, Presbytery noted that the Rev Sharmann Maromo will continue in his role as Assistant Minister at Cults Parish Church following completion of his familiarisation process. The role aims to provide support in Parish Ministry and to encourage and develop mission and outreach within Cults Parish Church and the Grouping. This is a centrally funded post for up to 18 months and has no implication on the Presbytery's staffing numbers. The Rev Corné Randall is involved in the same scheme. Sharmann is currently staying at Peterculter Parish Church manse.

Founder's Day Visit by Moderator

It has long been a tradition that the Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland visits Aberdeen City for the University Founder's day. This visit has included links with Aberdeen City Council and the former Presbytery of Aberdeen. At a service of worship within the Presbytery the Moderator preached and presented long service certificates.

In 2024 with the new Presbytery of the NE and Northern Isles, the Moderator, the Rt Rev Sally Foster-Fulton, has offered to be present at two services. The first will be at an evening service on Friday the 9th of February in Kingshill Trinity Church, Westhill. The second will be on Sunday the 11th of February, at the joint worship in Fraserburgh.
