Dear friends

When I pray, I think of a thousand things I need to do. I forget the one thing I set out to do: PRAY. I am not the first to struggle. When one of the disciples requested "Lord, teach us to pray", none of the others objected.

In fact, the only tutorial they ever requested was on prayer. They could have asked for instructions on many topics: bread multiplying, speech making, storm stilling but their request was "Lord, teach us to pray".

Jesus gave them a prayer. Not a lecture on prayer. Not the doctrine of prayer. He gave them a quotable, repeatable, portable prayer - the Lord's prayer.

While on holiday I picked up a book entitled "Before Amen" by Max Lucado. The back cover said "Wouldn't we like to pray. More? Better?

Stronger? With more fire, faith and fervency". I opened the book and read on. The author suggests that the prayers of the Bible can be distilled into one. The

result is a simple, easy-to-remember, pocket size prayer:

Father, You are good,

> I need help. Heal me and forgive me. They need help. Thank you.

> > In Jesus' name. Amen

I have found this prayer helpful and hope that you find it helpful too. I begin my morning, Father, you are good. As I walk through the house to pick up my laptop and diary, I need help. As I wait in the supermarket queue, They need help. This prayer punctuates my day.

Prayer for most of us is not a matter of a month-long retreat or even an hour of mediation. Prayer is conversation with God while driving to work or awaiting an appointment. We speak. He listens. He speaks. We listen. This is prayer in its purest form. God changes his people through such moments. He is changing me though the power of a simple prayer!

In the church extension there is a box for prayer requests should you wish us to pray for you or a particular situation. Preparations are underway to call a new minister to the parish so we could all make it a priority to pray for applicants and our nominating committee during this process.
