#### PRESBYTERY MATTERS

#### **Visit of the Moderator of the General Assembly**

It had long been a tradition that the Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland visited Aberdeen City for the University Founder's Day. This visit included links with Aberdeen City Council and the former Presbytery of Aberdeen. With the new Presbytery of the North East and Northern Isles now entering its third year, choice of venue for a Moderator to visit has now moved further afield.

At the Presbytery meeting on 3rd of December 2024 it was noted that it was the intention to hold a Presbytery Service with the Moderator, Rt Rev Dr Shaw Paterson, at 7pm on Friday 14th February 2025 in Inverurie West Parish Church. During the service long service certificates will be presented by the Moderator to elders who have been active for not less than 30 years of service with further certificates available for elders who have served for additional 10 year intervals.

The next Presbytery meeting is online on Tuesday 3rd February 2025.

#### **DRUMOAK-DURRIS PROPERTY UPDATE**

Both Drumoak and Durris Churches are being marketed for sale by the Church of Scotland. Each building has at the time of writing been visited by three or four interested parties resulting in a suitable offer to purchase being received for Durris Church. Completion of this sale is likely to take a couple of months or so whilst legal formalities are being completed. The church is being sold together with the log cabin and a narrow strip of land along the outside of the graveyard wall giving access to the cabin from the access road and providing a dedicated parking area for the property. The graveyard surrounding Durris Church remains owned by Aberdeenshire Council and is not therefore part of the sale.

At this time, one party has expressed an interest in purchasing Drumoak Church and it is understood this will lead to negotiations with the Church of Scotland General Trustees in Edinburgh.

You may be aware that the Rev. Corné Randall, who has been living with his family in the Drumoak Manse on Sunnyside Drive, was inducted to the vacant charge of Inverkip, Skelmorlie and Wemyss Bay on the Clyde coast at the end of January, leaving the property unoccupied. This property will also be marketed for sale by the Church of Scotland in the near future.

Ultimately, Peterculter Parish Church shall have property in three locations, the Church, Halls and Office in Craigton Crescent, the Manse in Howie Lane and the Church Hall on Sunnyside Drive, Drumoak.
