PRESBYTERY MATTERS

The new session of Presbytery started with an "all day" meeting on Saturday, 13th of September at Fountainhall at the Cross Parish Church.

With reports from nine committees and other matters having been circulated before the meeting, the business, with some discussion, was mostly completed in the morning.

In the afternoon a conference session was addressed by Professor Paul T. Nimmo, a theologian at the University of Aberdeen, who spoke about:

"Celebrating Nicaea"

1,700 years ago, in 325 AD, the first Council of Nicaea was a gathering of hundreds of Christian bishops from across the Roman Empire, called by the Emperor Constantine to resolve theological disputes and to establish a common understanding of Christian Doctrine.

From it came the Nicene Creed which affirms fundamental Christian beliefs. It was later revised in 381 AD. The Creed summarises essential biblical truths about God, Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit.
